

Program Summary

Family AIDS Care and Education Services (FACES) is an HIV prevention, care, and treatment program and prevention of mother-to-child transmission (PMTCT) program supporting 40 HIV service sites in Western Kenya (Kisumu, Suba, Migori, & Rongo Districts) and Nairobi and 24 PMTCT sites in Migori and Rongo Districts. By 31 Dec 2007, there were 26,030 patients enrolled in HIV care. Among those enrolled in care, 8,841 were on antiretroviral therapy (ART) including 640 children. FACES, in collaboration with District Ministries of Health (DMOH), City Councils, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), non-governmental organizations (NGOs), faith-based organizations, and private HIV health facilities, provides comprehensive HIV services, family planning, PMTCT, TB screening, counseling, and social support. FACES also continuously strives to increase local capacity through targeted trainings and Continuing Medical Education (CME) activities.
