

# FACES

## Program Summary



Family AIDS Care and Education Services (FACES) is an HIV prevention, care, and treatment and prevention of parent-to-child transmission program.

FACES supports 46 HIV service sites in Western Kenya and Nairobi

- 44 sites in Nyanza Province, Western Kenya and two in Nairobi.
- A summary of enrollment and sites per district is below in Table 1.

FACES supports 34 prevention-of-parent-to-child transmission (PPCT) sites in Migori and Rongo Districts, Nyanza Province, Western Kenya:

- Over 2,628 pregnant women were HIV tested, counseled, and received results between Jan-Mar 2008. Nineteen percent were HIV-positive and 85% of those HIV-positive received antiretroviral prophylaxis to help prevent HIV transmission to their infant.

FACES is a collaboration between the Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI) and the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF).

FACES partners with District Ministries of Health (DMOH), City Councils, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), non-governmental organizations (NGOs), faith-based organizations, and private HIV health facilities to provide family-focused, comprehensive HIV services which include family planning, PPCT, TB screening and care, prevention with positives activities, counseling, nutritional and social support. Additionally, *Uliza!* Clinicians' HIV Hotline provides HIV consultations via cellular phone to health care providers in real time.

To increase local capacity, FACES provides targeted trainings, close mentorship, and Continuing Medical Education (CME) activities.
